3. October fish fry.

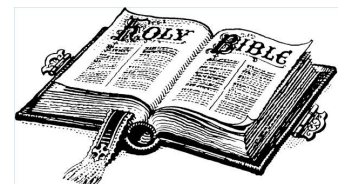
Again, I would like to thank the men who turned out and worked and made this year successful.
